Top Women CEOs Get Paid More On Avg, But Head Few Big Firms
With a \$8.5-million pay package in 2019, Advanced Micro Devices CEO Lisa Su became the first woman to top a list of highest paid CEOs, since it was first published in 2011. Su's compensation in 2018 was \$13.4 million. The majority of the 72019 pay came in the form of a one-time performance-based stock award. Among the 229 executives surveyed, 20 were women, just one more than the previous year. Top female bosses eamed a median pay of \$13.9 million, compared to \$12.3 million for the male counterparts
